Special Issue : Housing and the Housing Market

The French Housing Survey (conducted by INSEE, the National Institute of Statistics and Economic Studies) is a major statistical source : it provides sociodemographic and economic information on households and their housing conditions in terms of occupancy status, comfort, housing costs, etc. The 2013-2014 Housing Survey is the most recent of a series of regular surveys since 1955. These surveys, as well as other French public datasets (on housing price index, building permits, geospatial information on taxable income, Census), housing surveys in other European countries and European datasets (EU Statistics on Income and Living Conditions – SILC), and other sources (National accounts, OECD Statistics, financial data,...), allow to address a wide range of topics.

The *Economie et Statistique* Journal calls for articles for an upcoming special issue on housing and the housing market. We welcome articles addressing any of the following topics: inequalities in occupancy status, determinants of home ownership; housing affordability, housing costs and housing quality in social vs. private renting sectors; land and housing prices; housing supply and demand; residential mobility and labour market; social diversity and housing conditions; crisis and co-residence; ageing and housing; housing policies; international comparisons.
