## Vers un nouveau SCN en 2025 – Un survol du processus et des principaux projets de révision (intervention en anglais) - Jorrit ZWIJNENBURG (OCDE)

## Résumé:

Macroeconomic statistical manuals are regularly being revised in order to reflect changes to the economy, to process improvements in the measurement of specific economic phenomena, and/or to update the way in which results are presented to users. The last version of the System of National Accounts dates back to 2008 and a lot has changed since then, amongst others in relation to increasing globalisation and the emergence of digitalisation. Furthermore, the last couple of years have seen an increasing demand for data that provide more insight into household well-being and its sustainability, focusing on issues such as household distributional results and environmental-economic issues. Currently, the statistical community is working on the update of the System of National Accounts, to address these as well as several other issues, with the aim to have a new version available in 2025. This presentation will provide an update on the SNA revision process, shedding light on the main topics covered, as well as on the timeline for the overall update.
